What makes the York River area so important?

Rare & endangered species habitat

- Spotted Turtle
- New England Cottontail

- Saltmarsh Sharp-Tailed Sparrow
- Broad Beech Fern

Ecological value

- Cleans water running off land prior to reaching the ocean.
- Exports nutrients to marine food nets.

Economic value

- Acts as a protective buffer for storm surge.
- Provides scenic vistas that raise property values.
- Attracts tourism for wildlife observation, paddling, hunting, & fishing.

Public access

■ Through Mt. Agamenticus Preserve, Highland Farm, & McIntire Highlands Preserve.

Historical sites

• Contains remains of dams & mills from Punkintown settlements dating back to the 1700s.

"Environmentally, we live at the upper limits of the southern forests and at the lower limits of the northern forests so we have species of both. The same is true for the flora and fauna, or wildlife, giving a larger diversity of plants, animals, reptiles, turtles, etc., than is usual."
